The Canada Senior Games is a nation-wide program to sponsor and promote wellness and active living, among Canadians over the age of 55. Our goal is to produce a lasting influence on the knowledge, attitudes and behavior of older adults in Canada. The vision of the Canada Senior Games is to promote participation by all seniors in an active and enjoyable lifestyle.

The first national Games were held in Regina in 1996, and since then have been held in Medicine Hat (1998), Summerside (2002) and Whitehorse (2004).

The Games span a wide range of physical and mental challenges, from Slow-pitch Softball to Contract Bridge, from Darts to Lawn Bowling, and from Snooker to Track and Field. These events bring together amateur competitors who participate for the sheer joy of competition, for the opportunity to visit other parts of Canada, and for the camaraderie and social interaction that are an integral and essential part of the national Senior Games. The 700-1,000 seniors who participate in the Games representing their respective provinces or territories are but a small part of over 100,000 seniors who actively participate in local events leading up to the national games.
